It is with great sadness that I must report the passing of Bro. Jimmie Delp.

WBs Scott Dietrick, LeRoy Rosenthal, and Monte Dietrick performed the Masonic funeral service for Brother Jimmie Delp at Lincoln Memorial Funeral Home on April 17, 2017.

Bro. Jimmie passed away on April 8, 2017 at The Journey Hospice House surrounded by his loving family. He was born on January 16, 1924, on a farm near Panama, Nebraska, to Everett and Lillian Delp. He grew up in Lincoln as well as living in several small surrounding towns. He graduated from Lincoln Northeast High School in Lincoln, Nebraska in 1944. Jimmie married Patricia on November 22, 1944. To this union were born two sons; Sam and Jim, Jr. They were later divorced.

On January 16, 1945, Jimmie enlisted in the U.S. Navy and was honorably discharged in May, 1946. He served as a Master-At- Arms, also performing duties as a Pharmacist Mate, 1st Class

and later as Pharmacists Mate, 3rd Class while stationed at Balboa Naval Hospital in San Diego, California.

Jimmie married Marjorie Stover on September 25, 1954 in Hastings, Nebraska. To this union were born three sons; Douglas, Mark, and John. They lived in Lincoln, where they put down roots and made their home to raise their boys.

In September 2016, Jimmie and Marjorie celebrated their 62nd wedding anniversary; their marriage was a true testament to love and honor.

Jimmie's career began in 1952 with selling cars for **Duteau Chevrolet Company** in Lincoln, Nebraska. He opened, owned, and operated a Packard and Studebaker new car dealership from 1953 to 1958. He started Delp Auto Sales in 1963 and continued in the automobile business until 1992. During this time, Jimmie became part owner of their Church Council and as a newly-formed car rental agency, U-Save Auto Rental, bringing hometown affordable car rentals to the market.

Jimmie received several honors and awards of achievement for growing the company in the western half of the country.

In 1996, Jimmie sold his shares in U-Save Auto Rental and retired from the automobile industry to spend time traveling the country with his wife, Marjorie, in their Nebraska; Mark (and wife, motor home.

During his long career, Jimmie was the recipient of several honors and awards of achievement for his work with both U-Save Auto Rental and The National Independent **Automobile Dealers** Association, having served as the Secretary on the **Executive Committee of the** later for several years. During this time, Jimmie helped organize the Nebraska Independent Automobile Dealers Association, serving on the Executive Committee for several years and as President in 1980, 1981, and 1985. He was recognized as the State Quality Dealer for and 1986. Due to his love of traveling the road in his motor

home, Jimmie became interested in all aspects of that industry. He served as the President of the Spartan Chassis International Organization which is a division of the Family Motor Coach Association.

Jimmie was a member of the East Lincoln Lodge #210 AF & AM since 1991. He became PROFICIENCY a member of the Scottish Rite and the Sesostris Shrine in 1991. Jimmie spent several years transporting sick children from Lincoln to the children's hospitals in Minneapolis on behalf of the Shrine. Jimmie was honored as a Knight Commander of the Court of Honor (KCCH), with that rank being bestowed to him in 2010. Through the Scottish Rite, he also served as the Membership Chair for a program that provides treatment for children who cannot hear or speak.

Jimmie was a life-long member of St. James United Methodist Church, serving on Chair of the Finance Committee for several years. Jimmie gave his heart to Jesus at a young age when he was active in the Dutch Reformed Church. Jimmie was preceded in death by his parents, Everett and Lillian, and brother Ervin. Jimmie is survived by his wife, Marjorie Delp of Lincoln, Nebraska; sons, Sam Delp of Scottsdale, Arizona; Jim Delp, Jr. of Redlands, California; Douglas (and wife, Cindy) Delp of North Platte, Julie) Delp of Lincoln, Nebraska; and John (and wife, Sandy) Delp of Lincoln,

Nebraska; sister Dorothy Otoupalik of Lincoln, Nebraska; brothers-in- law Gerald Stover of Beatrice. Nebraska and Robert Stover of Wymore, Nebraska; 10 grandchildren, 11 greatgrandchildren; and other family and friends.



It was hot and the flight deck was a dangerous place, but I had "three hot's and a cot" and got to take a shower whenever I wanted it, even though it was a cold salt water shower. It broke my heart to see grown men with tears running down their cheeks after they left the Memorial. I hope the trip helps to heal them.

Equally sobering was the Korean War Memorial, which is very close to the Wall.

The trip was organized by Bill and Evonne Williams, co-founders of Patriotic Productions. Their hard work along with their cadre of volunteers, have organized and sponsored several Honor Flights for

WWII, Korean War & Vietnam War
Veterans. Everything having to do with the trip was organized and executed by the numbers and came flawlessly. Along with the Honor Flights, they are organizing "Remembering our

Fallen" exhibits in all 50 states. If you have a chance to volunteer or contribute to "Patriotic Productions," don't hesitate. They do good work! Upon return to Lincoln, we were all given a hero's welcome home by thousands who gathered at the Lincoln Airport to welcome our return. It was an unforgettable day.

Masons Without Aprons

A Brother in France forwarded me a message over the weekend concerning a lodge meeting in Versailles on the outskirts of Paris on the night of April 20th. Loge Lumiere Eccossais (Scottish Light) was holding its regular meeting, and unbeknownst to the members on this particular evening, the terror attack on the Champs-Elysées that killed police officer Xavier Jugelé was taking place.

The Tyler and Past Master of the lodge recounted the evening:

"During the course [of the meeting], the Venerable Master had read the nomination of a lay person who expressed the wish to become a Mason. A young man of 37 years. Looks like an excellent candidate! Not very unusual... Two minutes after the end of the meeting, we learn the terrible news of the shooting on the Champs, especially that of the death of one of the officers on duty at that time and place. Less than two hours after the end of the meeting, we learn that the policeman murdered is...the candidate talked about tonight.

It is. That's all... Some nights it's hard..." Officer Jugelé was deliberately shot in the head story when I first read it, last Thursday while sitting in because European his police van. He had been Freemasons frequently stationed there to help protect citizens and tourists on the densely packed avenue that my wife and I have spent countless hours on ourselves. With no warning, he became a victim himself. Two other police officers and a bystander were also wounded in the attack before the gunman, Karim Cheurfi, was shot and killed by police.

Cheurfi had previously been who were never themselves convicted of three attempted murders – two against police officers – after an incident in 2001. Sentenced to 20 years, he won a 2005 appeal and was released from prison early in 2013. A note expressing his support for Isis was found near his body Thursday night.

Jugelé's death brings the number of victims of Islamic terrorist attacks in France since the Charlie Hebdo incident in January 2015 to 239. Jugelé has been posthumously promoted and awarded the Legion of Honor. His public funeral service was held yesterday.

I did not originally post this encounter trouble in some quarters when publicly associated with the fraternity. However, it was given wide circulation on the L'Express magazine's Masonic-related blogsite La Lumiere, written by reporter François Koch, so nothing I could post here would reveal anything more to the public now.

There is a term some of us use to describe certain men Freemasons, but were certainly deserving of being called 'Brother' nonetheless: "Masons without aprons." Xavier Jugelé is one of these men.

Loge Lumiere Eccossais is affiliated with the Grande Loge de l'Alliance Maçonnique Française (GLAMF), a 15,000 member jurisdiction that broke away from the GLNF a few years ago during a major internal dispute over the Grand Master at the time.

Not that it matters one infinitesimal damn to the poignancy of this story.
