It is that time of year again, when the dues letters will be appearing in the mail boxes of our brethren. Dues are the primary source of income for the Lodge. We do have fund raising events during the year, but, dues are our bread and butter.

Unfortunately, like everything else, running the Lodge seems to cost more each year. Our savings seem to get smaller and smaller each year and we hate to diminish those savings. Any little bit extra can help the Lodge.

We also seem to have a handful of Brothers that forget to pay. This year we have about 20 Brothers that are behind from 2017. If you have not paid for 2017 please meantime the Masonic do so as soon as possible.

November is the month for election of officers and I will have the new slate in next month's issue. We will have installation in January and will kick off the 150th year of Lincoln Lodge's existence. We also plan for a rededication of the Lodge in May. More on this event later. This would be a good year to come back to a meeting on Tuesday night. Don't worry if you can't remember the passwords, we will help you, just come back and see us.

It will also be a great time to see the improvements that have been made in the Temple. You will be impressed! The front entrance including the doors have been rehabbed. The small Lodge room will have all the Dolan paintings restored, new carpet and paint. The room on the third floor, has been cleaned, new carpet, painted and will have new cabinets installed. The books in the basement will be moved to the third floor for a new library setting, just to name a few changes.

Last year was a banner year for new members with 8 new Brothers joining. We hope to continue this effort. Most of our new members are young and enthuastic and taking part in the weekly meetings.

To continue with a little of the Lodge history, I have included two articles from the 1918 history. Please note the number of members in 1873. The number increased from then, but we have decreased to almost that number in 2017. We need new members.

Where Lincoln Lodge Has **Been Quartered**

During the past fifty years, from its organization, Lincoln Lodge has occupied quarters as follows:

From May 4, 1868 to 1877 at Nos. 104-106 North 10th Street (the ground floor being occupied by Pflug Brothers, hardware merchants); 1877 to 1883, third floor of First National Bank Building, at the southeast corner of "O" and 10th Streets; 1883 to 1899, second and third floors of the Masonic Temple Building at northeast corner of "M" and 11th Streets. After the destruction of the Masonic Temple, September 16, 1899, the lodge occupied temporary quarters on the third floor of the Farmers and Merchants Bank Building, at the southeast corner of 15th and "O" Streets. In the Temple Association acquired title to the property known as the Webster Block, laying immediately north of the old Masonic Temple site, remodeling the buildings in suitable manner for occupancy as lodge rooms, and leased same to Lincoln Lodge and other affiliated bodies, where the lodge is maintaining its quarters at the present time, with the hope and expectation that the lodge, together with its affiliated bodies, will in the near future be enabled, through its business management, "The Masonic Temple Association" to erect a modern Temple on ground now owned (100 x 142 feet) on the northwest corner of

Membership, 1868—1918

"M" and 11th Streets.

The following table shows the number of Master Masons, Members of Lincoln Lodge No. 19, A. F. & A. M., in good standing on the respective dates given; compiled from the printed proceedings of the Grand Lodge of Nebraska from May 4, 1868 to and including March 31, 1912, and from the Lodge's retained copies of annual reports to the Grand Lodge from March 31, 1913 to March 31, 1918 inclusive.



Scottish Rite Renovation

Several months ago a transformation began at the Scottish Rite building here in Lincoln. It began simply enough; Then Venerable Master Don Gray mentioned to the SGIG's personal representative, Mike Gray, that the doors at the Lodge entrance could use a little face lift. Illustrious Brother Mike took this to heart and the doors soon had the attention they had needed. The leather was cleaned and preservative put on it to clean it and keep it soft and viable for years to come. The doors received new kick plates, and the brass fixtures shined and sealed. A worker was brought in and the door hinges and closers were rebuilt, straightened, and rehung.



The doors were just a beginning. The museum area downstairs desperately needed some love and a new member of the order stepped up, took responsibility for the project and organized, cataloged, and inventoried all of the material ensuring the items were not forgotten or worse, destroyed through neglect. Brother Nick Furchert, 32nd degree, was instrumental in having display cases brought up to the main floor outside the Lodge room so valuable artifacts could be displayed allowing everyone to enjoy them while keeping the collection safe from deterioration and secure.

While these improvements were significant, an even more substantial plan was in the works and plans for an entire renovation and upgrade of the dining area, kitchen, restrooms, and entry was in the works.



During the spring of 2017 the entire downstairs area underwent the demolition phase of the planned renovation under the watchful eve of Venerable Master Jerry Pigsley and Illustrious Brother Mike Gray. Upon walking in the first impression a person got was that an explosion had taken place! Light fixtures were dangling from wiring, bare studs were standing where walls had previously been, and the "head table" platform on the east side of the dining area had been removed. There

was a rough cut hole for a doorway leading out of the room where a storage area had been on the north east portion of the room and the pillars had been reduced to mere ceiling supports. The wooden floor had large areas removed and the stairs leading to the upper rooms had the marble tiles removed.



The place was a mess, and would stay that way for the next few months. At one point, all events were canceled, dust hung heavy in the air, and the entire area coming into the building looked as though it was one of the buildings of a metropolitan area left to deteriorate and collapse upon itself.



Nothing could be further from the truth! The first significant event to be held in the renovated building was the KCCH Investiture recently and the building looked fantastic in its new finery and glitz.



The entrance from the parking lot has new tile on the entry stairs giving the area a bright and inviting appearance, the doors refurbished and opened onto a beautifully apportioned stairway leading down to the reception room. This room has a wonderful elegance with new Romanesque pillars, fireplace, and area surrounding the mural that was already there which accented the painting and made it seem as though the room was there to showcase it. The new carpeting accentuates the walls and makes the room look warm and inviting. The furniture has not been put back in the entryway yet, but the overall impression can only be positive when it is replaced

with a room this beautiful. Entering the main dining room will cause you to stop and take in the entire room. The arches on the North end of the room have been reworked, all of the doors have a quiet elegance that only hardwood can bring, and the room has a spacious quality that invites you in. The fluted columns rise majestically and accent the room drawing your eyes to the new chandlers that hang from the ceiling. The floors and new stairway landings are beautifully stained hardwood and glisten when the lights illuminate the room.


