Thanksgiving Proclamation

Whereas it is the duty of all nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey His will, to be grateful for His benefits, and humbly to implore His protection and favor; and Whereas both Houses of Congress have, by their joint committee, requested me to "recommend to the people of the United States a day of public thanksgiving and prayer, to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many and signal favors of Almighty God, especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness:"

Now, therefore, I do recommend and assign Thursday, the 26th day of November next, to be devoted by the people of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being who is the national one now lately beneficent author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be; that we may then all unite in rendering unto Him our sincere and humble thanks for His kind care and protection of the people of this country previous to their becoming a nation; for the signal and manifold mercies and the favorable interpositions of His providence in the course and conclusion of the late war; for the great supplications to the great degree of tranquility, union, and plenty which we have since enjoyed;

George Washington for the peaceable and rational manner in which we have been enable to establish constitutions of government for our safety and happiness, and particularly the instituted for the civil and religious liberty with which we are blessed, and the means we have of acquiring and diffusing useful knowledge; and, in general, for all the great and various favors which He has been pleased to confer upon us.

And also that we may then unite in most humbly offering our prayers and Lord and Ruler of Nations and beseech Him to pardon our

national and other transgressions; to enable us all, whether in public or private stations, to perform our several and relative duties properly and punctually; to render our National Government a blessing to all the people by constantly being a Government of wise. just, and constitutional laws, discreetly and faithfully executed and obeyed; to protect and guide all sovereigns and nations (especially such as have shown kindness to us), and to bless them with good governments, peace, and concord; to promote the knowledge and practice of true religion and virtue, and the increase of science among them and us; and, generally to grant

unto all mankind such a degree of temporal prosperity as He alone knows to be best.

Given under my hand, at the city of New York, the 3d day of October, A.D. 1789.

We have several new members and those members have taken parts in the degree. This was their first proficiency examination. At the end of the night Steve mentioned that we had several new young members taking part and he was pleased to see this happening. He also declared that Lincoln Lodge No. 19 was proficient for the 87th year. This is quite an accomplishment. Congratulations to all the members who participated in this examination.

At the end of the month we were pleased to start two brothers on their Masonic journey by becoming Entered Apprentice Masons. We have welcomed Danial Schafer and Randal Hawthonre into our Lodge. The degree work was done very well and all brothers should be proud of their efforts.

This next article took place in November, but I wanted to get it in this month's issue.

On February 2, 2002, SSG Christopher Swisher joined our Lodge by being raised to the degree of Master Mason. He was an Army soldier stationed at Ft. Polk in Louisiana. His home was in Lincoln, Nebraska. Shortly after his raising he was transferred to Bagdad, Iraq. It was during this time that unfortunately he was killed in action during a routine patrol. Full military and Masonic honors were performed at his funeral.

Several years later there was a photo in a Pennsylvania Masonic publication showing some of their Brothers holding a Masonic meeting in Iraq with aprons made of white garbage bags. I received a call from the Grand Lodge office requesting me to come to the office to meet with MWB Dean Skokan, soon to be the Grand Master. He related to my story and told me he wanted to create a Lodge in a briefcase so that it could be sent to any Nebraska Brother to hold a Masonic meeting with all

the proper equipment to do such. He wanted to name this the Swisher Kit after my son-in-law, Chris Swisher. I told him I had no objections, but he should talk to his wife, my daughter, Kristen. This was approved and thus was born the Swisher Kit for Swisher Lodge Under Dispensation. Over the years the kit has been sent several times and degrees have been performed several times.

On November 10, 2018 several Brothers gathered, including Grand Officers, for a reunion of those who took their degrees in the Swisher Lodge. Two of these brothers had not



yet received their Master Mason Degree. At the direction of our current Grand Master, MWB Patrick Barger, Swisher Lodge Under Dispensation was opened in Bellvue Lodge No. 325, for conferring the Master Mason degree on these two brothers. The degree was performed in excellent form and all who attended were well pleased. The photo

above was taken of all who were in attendance. Brothers James C. Young (Washington, DC) and Ian Parker (Florida) expressed their thank you for this degree and the Brethren who were in attendance.

On a personal note, it is a great honor to have my son-in-law remembered by the Grand Lodge in this manner. He would have been very proud.


