Hidden in plain sight: Signs 500 buildings throughout the of a Mason

Brethren are rightfully proud of their association with the Craft. So much so that we continually leave Masonic sign posts to guide us throughout our travels. Examples? From symbolism and artwork to architectural influences, they're literally everywhere – if we keep our eyes open. Here are just a few:

- 1. Gravestones frequently include the Square and Compass, denoting the departed was a Mason. In this example, the Brother or his family chose to add what I interpret to be sprigs of acacia at the top of the marker, symbolizing that which can never die.
- 2. Columns are visible throughout our city. On the front of this building the Tuscan style, the most simple and solid of the five types of columns identified in our rituals, is repeated 10 times. 3. The Grand Lodge of Nebraska has laid cornerstones at more than



season travel to see family and friends, Holiday Parties for our groups, hands-on mission trips to help our been or plan to travel community, installations and initiations for our respective groups.


