And now....it's time for some historical trivia! On August 4, 1753, George Washington became a Master Mason. He was a young Virginia planter when he assumed the highest rank of Freemasonry. The

the first President of ceremony was held at the Masonic Lodge No. 4 in Fredericksburg, Virginia. Washington was 21 years old and would soon command his first military operation as a major in the Virginia colonial militia. For George Washington, joining the Masons was a rite of passage and an expression of his civic responsibility. After becoming a Master Mason, Washington had the option of passing through a series of additional rites that would take him to higher "degrees." In 1788, shortly before becoming the first

Washington was elected the first Worshipful Master of Alexandria Lodge No. 22.
