

We were very honored that WB Eric Bachenberg was selected to recite the "Memorial Day Order/ General Orders No. 11/Grand Army of the Republic" at both the Wyuka and Lincoln Memorial Services. WB Eric dressed in his Civil War regalia and gave an impressive presentation. General Orders No. 11 was issued on May 5.

1868 "designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late passed away on rebellion (Civil War), and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village, and hamlet churchyard in the land." Born in 1826, he was an American Solider and political leader.
