We look forward to an EA degree on April 20th.



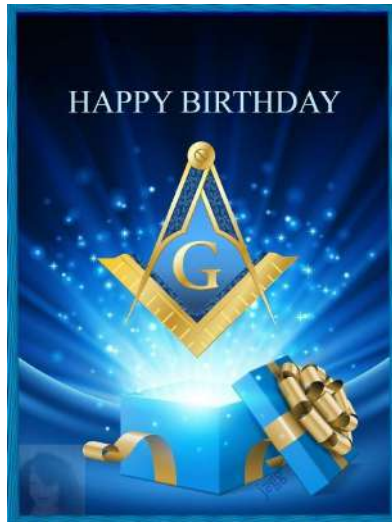

Our business meeting proved productive as we finalized our donations to Academic Scholarships, paid bills, and post-meeting libations/fellowship!

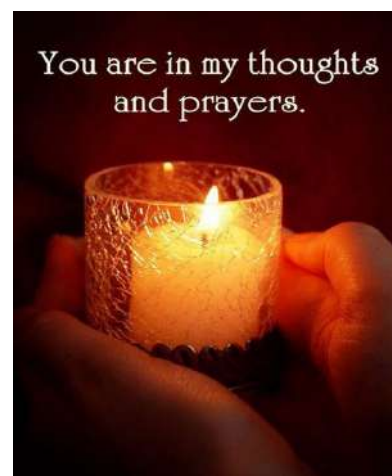

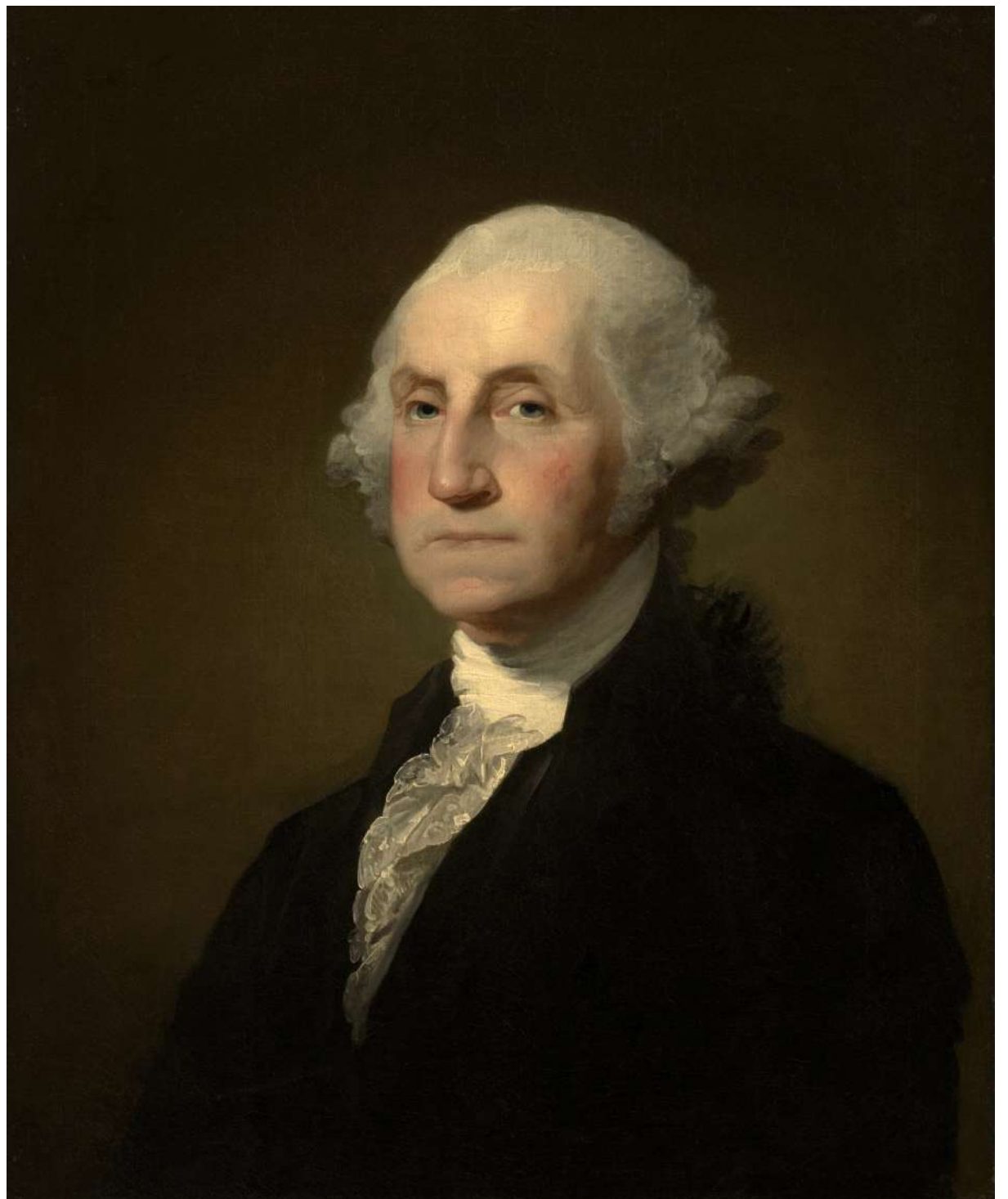
We look forward to seeing everyone in June! As always, you can enjoy your dinner by “eating in” or taking it “to go”!

September 2, 1666, Sunday. Bakery fire helps the start of modern Freemasonry.

Accepted and speculative masons. Words we all have heard and their meanings are not easily found. Accepted comes from the middle ages when a lodge of stone cutters/masons brought in a member who did not or would not work on stone in a practical sense. An architect would be an example.

Speculative, is more about the meaning and symbolism of the working tools, whereas the operative masons had the knowledge and skill to actually make a building out of stone, with their hands.

In the 1640's, English lodges started to admit members who were not workers in stone. Some of these men were scientists, others scholars, or philosophers. Lodges became less a social gathering and more of an area for discussing science and philosophy.

Now the Fire. It started around 1 AM at Thomas Farriner's bakery. The fire burned thru Thursday. Caused an unknown amount of deaths, 13,200 - 13,500 houses

burned 87 parish churches, 44 Company Halls, St. Paul's Cathedral, city prisons, and the list goes on including many public buildings and bridges. Approximately 15% of the city's housing was burned.

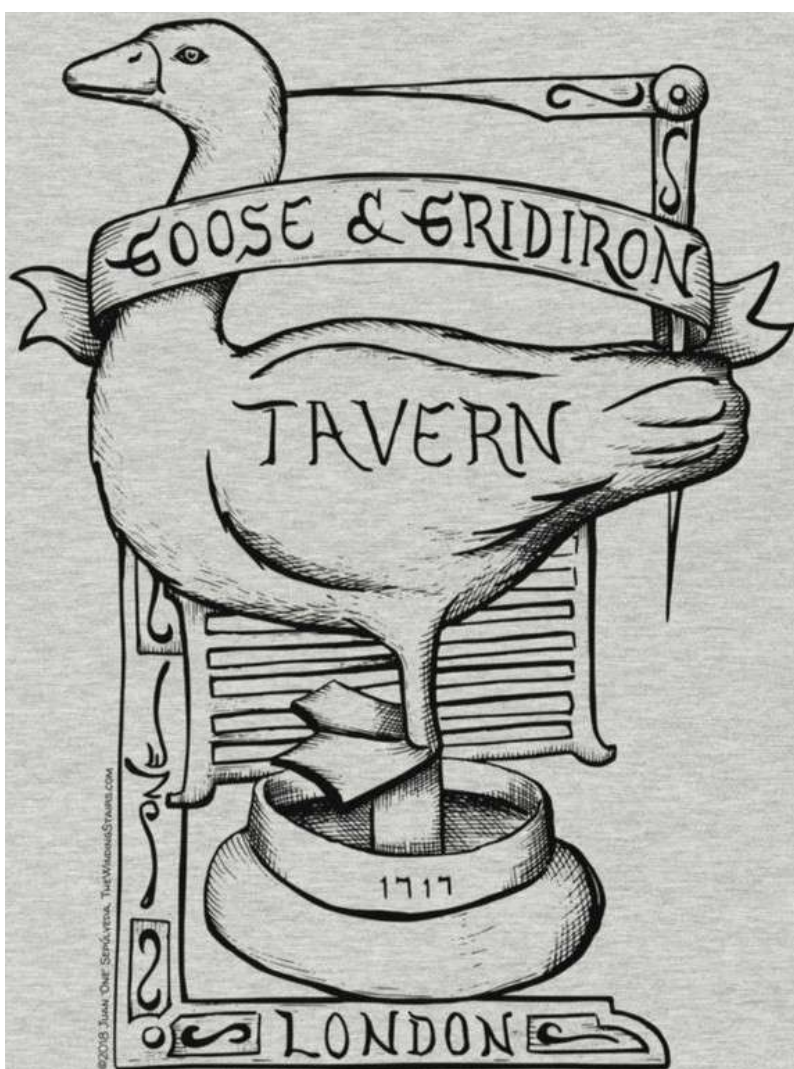
Reconstruction took almost 40 years. Operative masons came from all over to help rebuild London. Many of these men joined the Lodge of St Paul. When the work was complete many of the workers returned home leaving only 4 lodges in London.

During the reconstruction, London was becoming one of the larger cities in Europe. People were coming into the city for better paying jobs, security, seeking their fortune. There was a growth on the middle class. Gathering places were coffee houses and ale houses. Social clubs developed to cover all types of interests including masons.

In February 1717, the Rummer and Grapes, the Crown, the Apple Tree, and the Goose and Gridiron lodges gathered at the Apple Tree tavern to discuss the future of Masonry in England. It seems they all had a lot of "wants" and "rules" and the new Lodges, one thru four elected Anthony Sayer as the first Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of England. All of this done without the knowledge or

consent of any other Lodges in England, Wales, Ireland, or Scotland.

So there was one real fire which lead to, well... many other fires and this is part of our heritage.

Day 6: Put a promotional Job's Daughters sign in your yard.

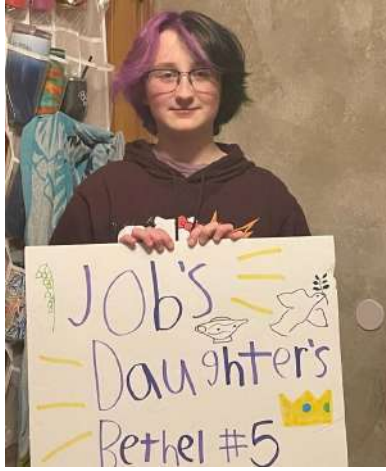
Day 7: Attend the St. Patrick's Day Prospect Event.
